- If I am hungry or thirsty, I can buy something to eat or drink in the museum café next to the reception. I am not allowed to eat or drink in the museum.
- I can take photos in the museum. I make sure I turn off the flash and do not use a tripod.
- If the guide or my assistant is saying something, I do my best to be quiet. I do my best to listen carefully.
